We are proud to announce the new *Schulich Leader Scholarships* program for students enrolling in the STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) areas of study at a participating Canadian university in fall, 2012. Those chosen as *Schulich Leaders* will ultimately help to ensure that Canada is at the forefront of excellence in science and research for generations to come.

The *Schulich Leader Scholarships* program asks every high school, secondary school and CEGEP (in Quebec) across Canada to select one student to represent their school as a *Schulich Leader Nominee*. From this pool of nominees, 20 pre-selected universities across Canada will each choose one outstanding student to be their *Schulich Leader*, each of whom will receive a four-year scholarship valued at \$60,000 to support their studies at that university in a STEM faculty.

The granting of scholarships will start at the beginning of the 2012 academic year at which time each selected university will be entitled to grant one scholarship. The number of scholarships awarded by each university will increase to two in 2013, and three in 2014. In 2015 and onwards, participating universities will be able to select 3 *Schulich Leaders* for that year.

As the administrators of this exciting new program, *UJA Federation of Greater Toronto* invites your school to participate and play a role in the future development of our great nation. Your participation in this vital initiative will not only benefit the country and those participating students, it will set your school apart from the pack as an educational facility that has educated and nurtured a future leader.
